


Scouts is the Start of Clean Drinking Water for All



Canada still has 91 long-term drinking water advisories active.

This means that people in 91 communities across the country do not have safe water to drink.





When you think of your water use, do you also think about the water that goes into making the things that you use every day? It takes 12 000 **litres of water** to make a smart phone, and over 55 000 gallons of water to make a typical car!

In 2017, the average Canadian was using 427 litres of water per day. This is the water we drink, bathe in, and flush our toilets with. Meanwhile, **30% of the world population** does not have enough water each day.



IN THE FIELD

In 2017 Canadian Scouting youth from the Tri-Shores Council, Scouts Canada and Central Escarpment Council teamed up with Ugandan Scouts to build a clean water source for the village of Kaazi in Uganda.
