

Plan:

- What other positions on the Crew Leadership Team would you consider?

Safety note:

- Determining which Rover Scouts will fill certain roles can be contentious. Your Crew should have a procedure (for example, casting ballots) prepared should more than one Rover be interested in the same position.

**The Adventure:**

Your Crew is led by an important group of Rover Scouts called the Crew Leadership Team. This group is concerned with the big picture for the Crew—not the specific details of adventures that are organized and led by ad hoc and temporary small teams. The Crew Leadership Team is responsible for promoting Crew membership, ensuring that the Crew's program is balanced (that is, there are adventures for every Program Area), managing Crew finances, taking care of the Crew's gear and so on.

Being part of your Crew Leadership Team is a great opportunity to develop some new skills. Investigate the roles on the Crew Leadership Team and volunteer for a position you're interested in.

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
