

North Star Award



The North Star Award is the top award you can receive while in Beaver Scouts. You will receive the award when you complete the following requirements:

PERSONAL PROGRESSION

Review your time in Beavers with your Lodge and Scouters. Think about everything you have learned in Beaver Scouts.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE SKILLS

Complete five (5) stages of Outdoor Adventure Skills.

SERVICE HOURS

To achieve your North Star Award, you must complete five (5) community service hours. These hours can include the time you spent on your North Star Award project.

NORTH STAR AWARD PROJECT

This is the final project of Beavers. This is done in your last year before you move up to Cub Scouts. With some help from the White Tail Council, you will complete a project to help your community.

PLAN:

- Choose a project that matters to you and that you believe will matter to a community. This community could be:
 - Local (your town, school, church, hospital, etc.)
 - National (Canada)
 - International (outside Canada)

You might pick up litter at a local park, make care packages for armed forces members serving overseas or send paper and pencils to a school in need in another country.

- Create a plan for your time. List the things you will need.

- Present your plan to your White Tail Council for its approval. Your Scouter will need to make sure your plan is safe.

DO:

Carry out your project.

REVIEW:

Share your project with the White Tail Council, your Lodge or your Colony. Tell the other Beavers about your project, and about what you learned along the way.
